ALFRED E. SMITH AWARD

The Alfred E. Smith Award is presented in recognition of outstanding service and initiative by an individual which has exemplified superior management and administration within New York State and which has contributed significantly to the resolution of a major government problem, or to the development of a major governmental program, or which has effected major economies and/or efficiencies in the governmental process. The service rendered, ***which may consist of a singular accomplishment***, should be far in excess of the normal expectation of the duties of the nominee's position and the level of the position within the organization.

ANNE ROEST **2008 ALFRED E. SMITH AWARD RECIPIENT**

Anne Roest has been a career civil servant since 1986, where she started out at the Department of Taxation and Finance. In her 11 years at the Department, she was promoted to multiple leadership positions, and was responsible for overseeing an information technology staff of over 400 and directed the modernization of the Department's IT infrastructure. In 2005 Ms. Roest came to the Division of Criminal Justice Services, where she is Deputy Commissioner and Chief Information Officer.

CHARLES EVANS HUGHES AWARD

The Charles Evans Hughes Award is presented in recognition of outstanding service by an individual which has exemplified superior management and administration within New York State and which has contributed significantly to the resolution of major governmental problems, or to the development of major governmental programs, or which has effected major economies and/or efficiencies in the governmental process **over an extended period of time**. The service rendered should be far in excess of the normal expectations of the duties of the nominee's position and the level of the position within the organization.

JULIA (DAY) LEDERMAN 2008 CHARLES EVANS HUGHES AWARD RECIPIENT

Julia (Day) Lederman began her career at the Division of Human Rights as an investigator, quickly gaining praise for not only her investigative skills and treatment of people involved in the complaints, but also for her community outreach efforts. As she advanced over the years, her training and mentoring of new investigators was critical to the enforcement of the New York State Human Rights Law—the first anti-discrimination law in the country. In 2005 Ms. Day was appointed Regional Director, where she continues to be an advocate for civil rights, inspiring her workforce, and developing partnerships with community organizations that are vital to the Division of Human Right's mission.

Ms. Day has “dedicated her entire adult life to protecting and furthering the civil rights of all New Yorkers. This commitment to civil rights and the to rights and needs of New Yorkers has contributed greatly to eradicating and preventing discrimination and to improving the lives of New Yorkers, many of whom have been neglected or abused by society at large.”

FRANK C. MOORE AWARD

The Frank C. Moore Award is presented in recognition of outstanding service by an individual that has exemplified superior management and administration ***within local government***, and which has contributed significantly to the resolution of a major governmental problem, to the development of a major governmental program, or that has affected major economies and/or efficiencies in the governmental process. The service rendered may be recent and singular or may encompass a series of accomplishments over a period of time. Such achievements should be far in excess of the normal expectations of the duties of the nominee's position and the level of the position within the organization.

FRANK A. LEAK

2008 FRANK C. MOORE AWARD RECIPIENT

Frank A. Leak has provided invaluable service over the years, working towards goals such as improving the Colonie Fire Company facilities; the reconstruction and remodeling of the Central Avenue Family Outreach, a facility that caters to families and teens; and the construction and complete of the Cook Park Amphitheatre, which now bears his name. His latest project was a \$400,000 expansion of the Senior Citizen's Center. In his spare time, Mr. Leak finds time to volunteer for various athletic leagues and the Boy Scouts of America, as well as taking an active role in Knights of Columbus and the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks.

NEW ADMINISTRATOR AWARD

The New Administrator Award is presented in recognition of individual service which has exemplified superior management and administration by an administrator within New York State **with less than ten years of public service**, and which has contributed significantly to the resolution of a major governmental problem, to the development of a major governmental program, or that has effected major economies and/or efficiencies in the governmental process. The service rendered should be far in excess of the normal expectation of the duties of the nominee's position and should reflect promise and potential for the nominee to assume future high level positions within government in New York State.

DAVID LARA 2008 NEW ADMINISTRATOR AWARD RECIPIENT

David Lara is a graduate of the University of Washington and the LBJ School of Public Affairs at the University of Texas at Austin. In his early career he worked on youth and minority issues, focusing on empowerment of disadvantaged students. Mr. Lara joined the New York State Division of the Budget in 2005 as part of the prestigious Carey Fellow program, and quickly became a key player in health care policy in New York State.

ESCAC ASPA SCHOLARSHIP

The Empire State Capital Area Chapter of the American Society for Public Administration

The Empire State Capital Area Chapter of the American Society of Public Administration (ASPA), the nation's most respected society representing all forums in the public service arena, was organized in 1942 as a discussion group of twenty-five persons to address the lack of professionalism and training in the newly expanded state government. The chapter (known until July 1989 as the Capital District Chapter) was officially chartered on December 5, 1945.

On July 1, 1989, the chapter changed its name to the Empire State Capital Area Chapter in order to distinguish it from other "capital area" chapters and to more accurately define the area it covers.

The chapter was instrumental in creating the Albany Graduate Program in Public Administration in September 1947. The school was originally co-sponsored by Syracuse University and New York University but is now part of the Rockefeller College of Public Affairs and Policy, University at Albany, SUNY.

During the 1980's, the society's main area of concentration was ethics in government. The chapter does no lobbying; instead, ESCAC-ASPA tries to improve government through the sponsorship of training, seminars, and workshops.

Most recently, the Chapter, in cooperation with the State Academy for Public Administration, has been instrumental in the development of Essentials of Public Administration in New York State, an award winning training program that has, for the last six years, provided a mechanism for leaders and emerging leaders in New York State government to learn about the mechanics of state government; to learn the processes that make policy into implemented program.
